Maureen (Mahon) Prokipchak, 64 of Manchester, CT, formerly of Somers, CT and Lansdale, PA, beloved wife for 43 years of J. Martin "Marty" Prokipchak and loving mother of the late Lauren Prokipchak, died Friday, October 19, 2018 at Manchester Memorial Hospital after a brief illness.
