Michael Andrew Klein, 51, of Vienna, VA passed away on January 12, 2017 after a valiant three and a half year battle with colon cancer. Mike's favorite motto throughout all the treatments and surgeries was

"Power Through!" His family has termed his profound impact on the lives he touched as the "ripple effect of Mike."

He is survived by his wife Patria Mesina Klein and their three daughters, Genevieve (17), Jacqueline (12), and Gabrielle (10), by his parents Robert and Lucille (Twardowski) Klein of Annapolis, MD, his siblings Bob and Suzanne Klein of Fairfax Station, VA and Linda (Klein) and Tom Lynch of El Segundo, CA. The extended Mesina family, both stateside and in the Philippines, also survives him. Mike adored his many nieces and nephews, especially, Ian and Danica Cruz, who he treated as his own children.

He was born November 1, 1965 in Reading, PA. Mike graduated from Lansdale Catholic High School (Lansdale, PA), the University of Notre Dame (Notre Dame, IN) and from Stanford Graduate School of Business (Stanford, CA). He co-founded Latinum Network in Bethesda, MD in 2009. Mike worked for the Corporate Executive Board in Washington, DC and Marriott Corporation in Bethesda, MD. He left a lasting legacy with hundreds of colleagues worldwide.

Mike was deeply dedicated to his family and was filled with profound faith. He loved traveling with Patria and the family around the world. He was a voracious reader and found inspiration and solace in books throughout his lifetime. Mike's brilliant mind was reflected in his writing.
