


## **In Loving Memory**

Anthony "Tony" Sandone, age 79, of Colmar passed away on Saturday, June 7, 2025, at his home surrounded by family. Born on September 3, 1945, in Norristown, he was the son of the late Joseph and Mary (nee Calise) Sandone.

He is survived by his loving wife of almost 60 years, Kathleen (nee Pino) Sandone, daughters Denise Carr

In 1964 Tony graduated from Lansdale Catholic High School, where he was a 3 sport athlete and Varsity Letterman all 4 years. His performance on the field earned him an induction into the North Penn-Souderton Football Hall of Fame in 2000. After his playing days he went on to coach football for CYO and also his old alma mater LC. A TV documentary was made of Coach Sandone coaching CYO football in 1971.

After High School, in 1965, Mr. Sandone attended Arena Barber School and spent 5 years in that profession. Later he worked as a Baker at his wife Kathy's family Bakery. Tony had a passion for Italian food and eventually owned and operated Sandone Restaurant and Pizzeria and worked in the food industry for most of his life.

He was a longtime member of the Sons of Italy and was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2001.

Throughout his life he was an avid Philly sports fan.

His greatest love in life was for his family.

In addition to his parents, he is preceded in death by his grandson Javiyon and sister Maryann Russello.
