John T. Bryner, 43, of Malvern, died Sunday, July 28 at Chester County Hospital after bravely battling an aggressive form of cancer.

Born December 23, 1980 in Lansdale, PA to John J. and Patricia (Brown) Bryner, John grew up in Hatfield and graduated from Lansdale Catholic High School in 1999 where he was a standout on the Crusaders football team. In 2003, he graduated from Lehigh University, where he played left tackle on the football team and established many meaningful relationships that he cherished throughout his life.

John overcame health issues in 2010 and in typical fashion, defied the odds and made a strong recovery, going on to earn his MBA from Villanova University. He established a successful career in finance, most recently as Chief Financial Officer at iPipeline, where he worked for over a decade and developed countless long-term friendships.

John embodied a larger-than-life persona that was only matched by his physical size. Warm, intelligent, and wickedly funny, he drew people to him wherever he went and led a life filled with laughter, friendships, and memories.

Passionate about all things Philadelphia, he loved Philly food and Philly sports. He was a lifelong Eagles fan and as a season ticketholder, he was happiest spending his Sunday cheering on his team with his friends and family. He regarded the Eagles 2018 Super Bowl win as one of the greatest moments of his life.

John was adored by his family and always made time for coaching or enthusiastically cheering for his kids' teams from the sidelines. He and his wife Emily were married in 2020 and over the last four years, acquired two dogs, Lucky and Arnold, and two cats, Midge and George. His family and the crazy pets were sources of great comfort to John during his final days.

He is survived by his wife Emily (Brennan), children Caitlin and Ryleigh Bryner, and Spencer Burling, as well as his mother Patricia, sister Alicia McIlhinney, wife of Joseph, and nieces Audra and Joanna McIlhinney, of Lafayette Hill.
