Theodosia Ann Tamborlane, born in Norristown, Pennsylvania, daughter of Theodosia Uhorczyk and John Glueck, died peacefully on May 14, 2026, in Dunedin, Florida where she resided. Affectionately known as “Theo” and “Dosia,” she is survived by her three children Alison,

Rebecca, and Roger and her five grandchildren Rachel, Alyssa, Kaanan, Corbin, and Cyprian.

Throughout her life, Theo was a champion for women’s rights and gender equality. Notable appointments during her early years included selection as a NJ delegate to the historic 1977 Women’s National Conference in Texas and, in 1978, vice-chairperson of the NJ Commission to Study Sex Discrimination in the Statutes.

Theo’s journey continued with trailblazing careers in both law and art. Prior to founding her own healthcare and employment law firm in 1989, she served as Deputy Attorney General assigned to the NJ Department of Health. She took great pride in having her daughter later join her law practice and they formed one of the few mother-daughter law firms in the country. Theo fought tirelessly for her clients, big and small, throughout her legal career.

After retiring from practicing law, she pursued a career in art becoming an abstract artist, illustrator, and poet. Since 2008 her works have been in over 180 solo and group exhibitions in New York City, NJ, PA, and FL. Her paintings are in private and public collections in the United States, Japan, and the Netherlands. She also found great pleasure in gifting her works to family and friends and has donated many of her pieces to hospitals and other nonprofit organizations nationwide.

Theo’s strong will and self-determination never allowed her to submit to the aging process and she fought to be independent until her final

breath. She will be forever immensely missed and loved by those whose lives she touched. May her memory be a blessing.
